Bay View Lodge:

Tucked away along the serene shores of Cross Lake, Bay View Lodge has been a beloved destination for families, couples, and outdoor enthusiasts since 1945. In 1956, H.J. (Butz) & Luella Pass expanded Bon Repoz resort and painted the cabins a bright Pepto-Bismol pink, creating a distinctive look which became part of the resort's charm. In 1975 the Gregg brothers purchased the resort. They continued to expand the property adding an additional 3 cabins. In 1977 the Gunelson Family took ownership and made significant improvements to the property. They added stairs to the lake and added a Lodge for guests to congregate. The Berg family took ownership in 1987. Jim and Mary Ann Berg renamed the resort to Bay View Lodge and worked tirelessly to enhance the resort by adding an onsite boat ramp, a seasonal campground, and remodeling every cabin. Jim and Mary Ann retired in 2018 and passed down the legacy to their son, Tim. Tim and his wife, Patricia, and family currently operate the resort in hopes to continue the history and tradition of Northern Hospitality.

Black Pine Beach Resort:

Riding the wave of public demand for lodging facilities in the increasingly popular Whitefish Area, a banker from Salem, NE, put up the money for a friend named Marion Arnold to come up north and build a resort on a piece of property on Pig Lake in an area known as Black Pine Beach. Marion and his wife, Anne, armed with some money and a dream, packed their belongings and made the long trip from Salem to Ideal Corners, MN.

The year was 1939. Marion was not a carpenter, so he hired the cabin construction done. This was an unusual approach. His cabins were constructed with Western lumber.

The Arnolds owned the resort for many years. Finally, age and failing health forced them to sell in 1968. For 9 years, Black Pine Beach Resort was owned by a train engineer and his wife who cut back the operation to only 6 weeks a year. It became a hobby resort. But, through all these changes, the banker's family, now the next generation, continued to vacation at Black Pine Beach every summer. In 1977 the train engineer and his wife divorced and the resort went up for sale by owner. Bob and Lynn Scharenbroich purchased the early parts of 1978. Making all the life changes at once, Bob and Lynn loaded up all their belongings and the new baby, and took off for the beginning of a new life only 5 miles from Lynn's childhood home. They operated the resort until they retired in 2023, when Jeff and Jackie Novitsky purchased and took over operation

Boyd Lodge:

Welcome to Boyd Lodge established in 1934 located in beautiful Crosslake, Minnesota! We are a premier year-round lakeside resort on the shores of both Rush Lake and Lower Whitefish Lake. During the summer, we specialize in the traditional family lake vacations you remember from your youth: turtle races, root beer floats, scavenger hunts, swimming, fishing, and pretty much everything from your childhood trips to the lake.

Clamshell Beach Resort:

Clamshell Beach was founded in 1938 by Henry Ecklund, a single man who quickly found out that taking care of all the details associated with guests and cabins were more than one person could take care of. The property had several resort owners sine then. In 1997 the resort was sold to David and Lisa Moe. When they bought the resort there were twenty two cabins – eleven 1950/60s vintage mobile homes, ten cabins and an owner's home. The ages of the cabins were 34-59 years old. Six of those ten cabins were located inside the Shoreland Impact Zone and their average size was just 608 square feet. Today, all the mobile homes have been removed and the resort consists of 17 cabins, 8 units have been added since 2004 and the resort actually has less bedrooms on the property than when they bought the resort. In 2008, the resort was approved by the Minnesota Commerce Department to sell its resort cottages on a Fractional Basis. This resort model is used throughout the United States in exclusive areas to provide a common sense approach to buying a luxury

asset – without the hassles of maintenance – while also assuring that people will continue to have access to the public resources.

Kilworry Resort:

Kilworry resort is located in the city of Pine River off of County Road 1. Located on Whitefish Lake of the Whitefish Chain. Kill-Worry Camp, owned by Charles Webber, who had built the four cabins there from the logs he cleared off the land in 1917. In 1943, Mr. and Mrs. George Coughlin Sr. purchased the camp and changed the name to Kilworry Resort. Today, Norma Coughlin and her five children own the resort. The place grew from four cabins to 12, with all of the original cabins replaced and improved. At one time there was no running water in the cabins. Staying at Kilworry meant pumping and hauling water, warming the cabin with wood heat, eating regular fish dinners, keeping food cold with ice blocks delivered by Bud Coughlin and using outdoor toilets. Today the Kilworry cabins have electricity and plumbing, and one has air conditioning.

Pine Terrace Resort:
