Empowering families to support their child's success.












#### **National PTA School of Excellence Program**

- **Step 1:** Enroll and Gain Support (June 1 –Oct. 1)
- **Step 2:** Deploy Baseline Survey (Sep. –Nov.)
- **Step 3:** Set a Shared Objective (Sep. –Nov.)
- Step 4: Complete Initial Application (Submit by Nov. 1)
- **Step 5:** Follow Roadmap to Excellence (*Throughout School Year*)
- **Step 6:** Deploy Final Survey (March –June)
- Step 7: Complete Final Application (Submit by June 1)
- **Step 8:** Celebrate Your Excellence (Aug.)

More Ways of Being Diverse

School district / state, etc. of birth or youth

Or has lived in multiple states

Rural, urban or suburban in origin

Military status

Number of parents in household

Whether a parent stays at home

Only child or one of siblings

Foster status



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Recognize Diversity and Be as Inclusive as Possible

However please remember racial inclusivity

Current research tends to show

nonracial inclusivity

Also instead of not seeing skin color

See and appreciate all colors of skin





### Additional Reasons to Be As Inclusive as Possible

Grow membership

(VERY IMPORTANT to legislative advocacy efforts of PTA)

Reflect the children and families your unit serves

Know the needs of your unit better

Be more responsive to the needs of your unit

Reach more families / have programs and events be better attended

Stand on the correct side of history

It is the right thing to do





What to do

Know thyself

In addition to your unit's general self assessment and plan for improvement

National PTA DAI self assessment tool





What to do

Brainstorm all the friends whom you would like to welcome

Brainstorm all the ways would like to welcome friends

(Which may be dependent on whom you try to welcome--

ie, welcome parents who work outside the home

by holding meetings in the evenings or

in the mornings before they go to work)





What to do

Do DAMI self assessment

Survey your families

Appoint a DAI specialist (Local, Council and Region levels)

Hold a cultural night

Ask a friend to do a demonstrate how to prepare a dish from his or her culture

Hold topical mini DAI trainings at each Executive Committee, Board or General Membership Meeting

In addition to forwarding entries onto state could even award local entries



What to do

Whatever level you are at in inclusion

Or at any of your other organizational or personal goals

try to advance them all by at least one level

Constant improvement

If overwhelmed start small

Do one inclusive thing for one diverse group of friends





What to do

Otherwise try to incorporate DAMI

into your overall plan for improvement as much as possible

Ultimately PTA wants you to have the strongest unit you can possibly have
