# About HWCLI and HEALI

HEALI was founded as a coalition within the [Health and Welfare Council of Long Island \(HWCLI\)](#) with support from the New York State Department of Health as part of the Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP), a program that uses federal funds to help improve healthcare delivery systems.

Since the end of DSRIP, HWCLI supported HEALI's ongoing efforts to maintain the regional coalition, [continuing to engage nonprofits across Long Island in health equity-focused work](#), as well as engaging partners in work leading up to NYHER.

In 2024, [HEALI was named Long Island's SCN](#), with HWCLI as lead entity.
