



Columbus County School takes on FAFSA Completion



2023 (State FAFSA - 62%)

- 59% of our CCS students completed FAFSA in 2023*
- 70% of CCS graduates reported intentions to enroll in postsecondary institution*
- 55% of CCS graduates actually enrolled in a postsecondary institution*






Subject: FINAL FAFSA UPDATE: WE WON!




Students are more likely to attend higher education after exposure to messaging





MESSAGING KEY TAKEAWAYS



SCHOLARSHIP

Know what you're getting. Know where you're going.

Most students from households making \$80,000 or less will qualify

3. Be Transparent

Pro-Tip: Use monetary values
\$ to capture more interest

Students attending a NC public institution will get at least:

\$3,000 to cover all tuition and fees at a NC community college \$5,000 to cover more than half, if not all, tuition and fees at a UNC university Most eligible students qualify for even more





NOW IT'S YOUR TURN...



REFLECTION: rate 1 = not very good, 5 = excellent








Get money for college that you don't have to pay back.

That's right. The Next NC Scholarship is a financial aid program that helps most North Carolinians from households making \$80,000 or less pursue a higher education, by fully covering tuition and fees at any community college or more than half of, if not all, tuition and fees to attend any public university in the state. The best part? It's money that doesn't have to be repaid.



Where does the funding come from?

Key players in the state have worked together to consolidate state financial aid for public colleges and universities and combine it with federal financial aid, making it easier for North Carolinians to know how much they can get so they can make the most informed decisions for their future. The State of North Carolina has committed nearly \$180 million of financial aid for residents who qualify.

TOTAL STATE FUNDING \$148 MILLION




