
SECTION 504 AND STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

"No otherwise qualified individual with a disability...shall, solely by reason of his or her disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."





SECTION 504 IS A CIVIL RIGHTS LAW



- Section 504 ensures that the child with a disability has equal access to an education.
- The child may receive accommodations and modifications.
- Enforced by the Office For Civil Rights.




WHO IS PROTECTED?



- 1. Have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; or
- 2. Have a record of such an impairment; or
- 3. Be regarded as having such an impairment.



Where Does Section 504 Fit?





NOTICE OF PARENTS RIGHTS AND PROCEDURAL SAFEGUARDS

Section 504 requires schools to establish and implement a system of procedural safeguards with respect to the identification, evaluation, or educational placement of students with disabilities.



§504 COMMITTEE

Must consist of at least two persons knowledgeable about the student, the meaning of the evaluation data, and the placement options.

ELIGIBILITY QUESTIONS



1. Does the student have a physical or mental impairment?

2. Does the impairment impact a major life activity?

3. Is the impact on the major life activity substantial?

4. Does the student need Section 504 accommodations to participate to the same extent as non-disabled peers?



What is a Section 504 Plan?







7 Tips for a Good 504 Plan

- 1. Be proactive about being part of the process.
- 2. Make sure the plan is personalized to your child.
- 3. Cover all areas where your child needs support.
- 4. Describe each service in specific terms.
- 5. Be sure the plan names personnel.
- 6. Check in with your child and teachers.
- 7. Review and update the 504 plan once a year.

Parent/Guardian Rights

As a parent or legal guardian, you have the right to:

- Receive notice regarding the identification, evaluation and/or placement of your child;
- Examine relevant records pertaining to your child;
- •Request an impartial hearing with respect to the district's actions regarding the identification evaluation, or placement of your child, with an opportunity for the parent/guardian to participate in the hearing, to have representation by an attorney, and have a review procedure;
- File a complaint with your school District Section 504 Coordinator, who will investigate the allegations regarding Section 504 matters other than your child's identification, evaluation and placement.
